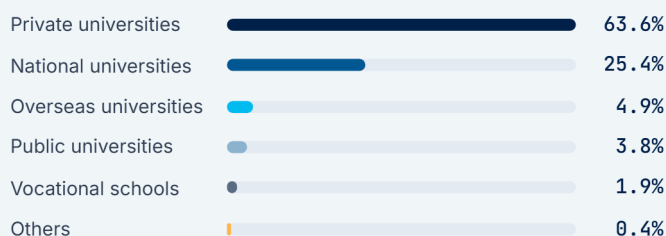

Learning enrichment programmes

Overseas Learning Programmes

Students extend their learning beyond Japan through overseas programmes, including language and academic experiences. By learning alongside local students and experiencing different cultures and communities, they develop independence, intercultural understanding, and a broader global perspective.

Study Abroad & International Exchange

MOIS provides opportunities for study abroad and international exchange through partnerships with schools and organisations overseas. Students communicate with people from different backgrounds, experience different approaches to learning, and develop confidence as members of a global community.

Learner Directed Time (LDT)

Learner Directed Time gives students dedicated opportunities to take greater ownership of their learning. With support from teachers and external experts, students pursue their own inquiries, develop projects, and connect classroom learning with real-world experiences.

English Inquiry

English Inquiry develops language through meaningful investigation and communication. Students explore questions, discuss ideas, and present their thinking in English, strengthening both their language proficiency and their ability to communicate increasingly complex ideas.

Inquiry Week

Inquiry Week provides an intensive period for students to explore meaningful questions beyond regular subject boundaries. Through investigation, collaboration, and hands-on experiences, students connect different areas of learning and develop new perspectives.

3G Project

The 3G Project encourages students to connect issues around them with wider global challenges. Students identify questions that matter to them, investigate their causes and impact, and consider how their ideas and actions can contribute to their communities.

Inquiry Presentation

Students share the outcomes of their inquiry with teachers, peers, families, and other audiences. Presenting their ideas and receiving feedback from different perspectives helps them refine their thinking, communicate more effectively, and deepen their learning.

All English

All English provides regular opportunities for students to communicate primarily in English. Through authentic interaction and purposeful activities, students build confidence in using English as a practical tool for learning, collaboration, and communication beyond the classroom.
